PRIVATE SCHOOL OFFERS DISTANCE ED

American Heritage School, an American Fork private school located next to the LDS temple, has announced the launch of an Internet-based distance education program, the *Deseret News* reported Friday. The school, which is not owned by the LDS church but was founded shortly after the closing of BYU Training School in 1968, currently serves 600 students attending grades K through 12. With American Heritage's distance learning program, anyone with an Internet connection can access nearly 50 courses ranging from Kindergarten Art, which costs \$55, to Gentile's advanced history course, which costs \$315, according to the school. American Heritage School was held in an old LDS chapel in Pleasant Grove until 2002, when it moved to American Fork.
